

## Dinghy Park Guidance

1. Ensure you pay the appropriate fee for your boat or trailer. Fees are listed in Appendix 1. Any unpaid vessel will be subject to our Abandoned Boat Policy in Appendix 2.
2. Contact the dinghy park co-ordinator if you wish to have a space in the dinghy park. Please do so before putting your boat in the dinghy park.
3. Boats / trailers may be left on a temporary basis. You must contact the dinghy park co-ordinator and the appropriate fee must be paid. The boat or trailer must be kept in the Temporary Storage area in the dinghy park.
4. Ensure you only use the space you have been given.
5. Ensure all straps / ropes are tidy, tucked into the boat and not trailing on the grass.
6. Ensure the boat is in a moveable condition with working wheels / tyres present and inflated.
7. Spaces are limited and will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.
8. The BSC accepts no responsibility for damage or loss to items kept in the dinghy park.

## **Appendix 1**

### Dinghy Park Fees

Adult Member Boat - £35

Child Member Boat - £25

Trailers - £30

Temporary Storage - £5 per boat / trailer per week

## **Appendix 2**

### Abandoned Boats

If after three months from the date fees payable to the Club by any member or former member are unpaid and a boat is left on Club property the Committee may take all reasonable steps to require the defaulting member to remove the boat.

A final notice in writing to the last known address of the member or former member shall be sent giving one month's notice for the removal of the boat.

At the end of this notice of one month the Committee may then:-

a) Move the vessel to any other part of the Club premises without being liable for any loss or damage to the vessel. however caused.

b) Sell the vessel and deduct any monies due to the Club (whether by way of arrears or subscriptions or annual payments of dinghy park fees) from the proceeds of the sale before accounting for the balance (if any) to the member or former member.

c) Alternatively, if the vessel is unsaleable, after giving notice in writing as aforesaid, dispose of the vessel in any manner the Committee may think fit and deem the cost of so doing and any arrears as aforesaid to be a debt owed to the Club by the member or former member.

Provided that proper evidence is available to show that all reasonable steps have been taken to trace a member or former member and that when and if the vessel is sold the proceeds of the sale (less any indebtedness by the member or former member of the Club) shall be placed upon bank deposit account and retained against the eventuality of a claim by the owner (whether he/she be the said member or former member or otherwise) for a period of six years.
