### Notice of Race

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

#### 1 1 Rules

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 All Class rules
- 1.3 Open to cruisers including 707s both IRC and local handicap. Spinnaker and non-spinnaker divisions available.
- 1.4 Crouch Harbour byelaws will apply
- 1.5 Competitors automatically grant to the organising authority without payment the rights in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live taped or filmed television of, or relating to, this event.
- 1.6 Competitors should note the Organising Authority implements the RYA Racing Charter and they will be required to undertake to sail in compliance with the Charter, which can be found in the front of the RYA rule book.
- 1.7 [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable instructions from an event official.

#### 3 Communications

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at BSC web site
- 3.2 [DP] All Cruisers shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on 37a
- 3.3 The race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the 37a M1.

3.4 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication. that is not available to all boats.

## 4 Eligibility and Entry

4.1 The event is open to all cruisers and 707s.

4.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form (available on the BSC website) and submitting it, together with the required fee, if they are not already entered for the season.

4.3 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete an entry form and pay all fees.

## 5 Entry fees schedule

5.1 As on the season entry form this series makes up part of the season, but can be paid for separately.

(b) When four or more races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores, excluding her worst score.

(c) When seven or more races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of her race scores, excluding her worst 2 scores.

## 22 Risk Statement

22.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

## 23 Insurance

23.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 3 million pounds sterling per incident or the equivalent.

## 24 Prizes

24.1 Prize giving: Final Sunday as soon as practicable after racing.

## Minimum Safety Equipment Rules for Cruisers

### 1 Buoyancy

- 1.1 Boats shall either be self-righting from 60 degrees or have enough reserve buoyancy to support the boat and crew for at least 30 minutes following a capsized. Boats shall be equipped with suitable means for bailing or pumping.

### 2 Fire Extinguisher

- 2.1 Boats carrying engine or cooking fuel shall carry a fire extinguisher and a stout bucket of 9 litres minimum capacity attached to a lanyard.

### 3 Personal Buoyancy and Man Overboard

- 3.1 Boats without lifelines or with lifelines which do not meet ISAF Offshore Special regulations Category 4 shall have personal buoyancy for each crew member at least sufficient to comply with RRS 40. Personal buoyancy shall be worn by all crew members at all times whilst racing.
- 3.2 Boats with lifelines which meet ISAF Offshore Special regulations Category 4 shall carry personal buoyancy or lifejackets for each crew member. Boats shall also carry a rescue quoit or throw bag with at least 15m of floating line or one lifebuoy or life sling.

### 4 First Aid

- 4.1 Boats shall carry a waterproof first-aid pack with instructions.

### 5 Anchor

- 5.1 Boats shall carry a suitable anchor and sufficient warp to hold the boat in 15m depth of water in the expected racing conditions.

### 6 Compass

- 6.1 Boats shall carry a suitable compass – handheld is acceptable.

### 7 Equipment

- 7.1 All equipment, fittings, and engines shall be securely fastened.

### 8 Propulsion

- 8.1 All yachts must carry a means of propulsion, other than the boat's sails.

### 9 Communication

- 9.1 Fixed or handheld VHF shall be carried at all times capable of transmitting and receiving Channels 37a.
